Goodbye Liturgy:

Leader:

Our church family is ever changing. Loved ones are born into the family and loved ones come to the end of their lives. Individuals come and go in our church life. It is important and right that we recognize these times of passage, of endings and beginnings. Today we celebrate the gifts you have brought to us through our pastor. Hear Paul's words written to the Ephesians:

Each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. Leader:

Paul's words remind us today, even as he reminded the Ephesians: to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness,

with patience, bearing with one another in love,

making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit

in the bond of peace.

There is one body and one Spirit,

just as you were called to the one hope of your calling,

one Lord, one faith, one baptism,

one God and Father of all,

who is above all and through all and in all.

continue to follow God's calling here.

People:

We release you from your promises to us, and we offer you our blessing as you leave to follow God's calling elsewhere. Leader:

O God, you have bound us together for a time as pastor and people to work for your church in this place. We give you thanks for the ministry we have shared.

We give you thanks for your patience with us despite our slowness of heart. We thank you for your forgiveness and mercy when we have failed.

We especially thank you for your never-failing presence with us through these years, and for the deepened knowledge of you and of each other.

We give you thanks for those who have been joined to this part of Christ's family through baptism. We thank you for opening our hearts and minds again and again to your Word, and for feeding us abundantly at your table. We remember those who have gone before and we look with hope toward those who will come.

Now, we pray, be with this congregation as we continue forward, and with Dayna as she begins a new path. Grant that all of us, by drawing closer to you, may always be close to each other in the communion of saints. All this we ask for the sake of Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord. Amen.
