The announcement was good news for them, us, and the whole world. So the angels sang in praise, and we are invited to join them.



# Station One Shepherds



We start beside Bethlehem where some shepherds were watching sheep. Luke tells us something amazing happened.

"There were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them,

"Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you: He is the Messiah, the Lord..." (Luke 2:8-12) About nine months before this, there was some personal drama in Nazareth between a couple who were engaged.
